FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



What a great beginning to another year of Sunday School! Rally Day should be important because we focus on making disciples through sharing the

stories of the Bible with the children of the congregation. Scripture reminds us that we should train up a child in the Word. I want to thank the small ensemble that was put together for special music. I asked them to do a difficult piece and they far exceeded what I asked of them. We are discussing their doing another song in the future. Zach Ewald has been reviewing music in order to start up a choir to sing on Reformation. If it goes well maybe we can also have them sing during the Christmas holidays.

By the time this letter reaches the congregation it will be time to think about Reformation and All Saints Day. Since our All Saints Day celebration last year, Trinity has had a number of our members who have gone to be with their Lord. On November 6 we will once again remember those who have departed this life in the faith. If you want us to remember a loved one, please let the church office know by October 28. We take a moment in worship to remember as the names are read that day.

The process for calling a pastor began with the congregation having a meeting on September 11 between services. Part of the process is to determine what the congregation would like to see in their next pastor. Each voice is important. One of the ways you have a voice is to fill out the sheet presented in the narthex with your thoughts. God has moved this congregation over the past two years to consider the importance of your ministry. I believe the celebration of 75 years of ministry for the school helped many to see the tremendous ministry that has shaped lives. While the process has begun, realize that there is a time to call for members to submit names. All names submitted need to be reviewed through the district. A call committee will need to determine how many names the congregation should consider, while what these meetings and thoughts from membership will help do is determine some strengths the whole congregation can agree on as you begin your search. I will be praying for the congregation and I would encourage all of you to pray that God will lead you to a pastor who will guide you in sharing the gospel and ministry that grows disciples.

I want to express my thanks to all of you who have encouraged Chris and me during our time in your midst. God is at work, too often we focus on what isn't working, missing them some of the great things God has been doing. I feel as though many of you are seeing the need to focus on what can do rather than what we aren't doing. Our God has worked through His church for centuries, not always as we see it, but God leading us to ministries that welcome sinners, and people in need of forgiveness and God's grace.

Chris and I will be leaving for about a week after November 6. We want to see a couple of places and spend some time in Branson, Missouri. Understand that November and December are great times to be there, enjoying the beauty of the Christmas season.

September 10, 2022

A meeting of the Executive Council of Trinity Lutheran Church was held on September 10, 2022, in the Narthex Lounge. Present were Council Members: Bob Thorgesen, Jason Reiter, Brenda Schmidt, Linda Klipp, Cheri Carsten, Debbie Thuener and Pastor Schnegelberger. Guest: Hank Thuener. A quorum was established. Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council. Vice-President Bob Thorgesen presided over the meeting. The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am. Pastor Schnegelberger opened with prayer. The August minutes were approved with corrections via email before the September meeting for inclusion in the September Tidings.

Treasurer's Report: Cheri Carsten, Interim treasurer, provided the August financial report via email prior to this meeting. Motion made by Linda Klipp, seconded by Jason Reiter to accept the report as presented. Discussion. Voice vote – report approved.

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries: Report by Pastor

- Service schedule set and approved through remainder of 2022.
- Pastor will be gone November 13, 2022.
- Heard report from DCE.

Board of Christian Education Ministries: Linda Klipp

- The scholarship campaign dates set – kick off “Cooks Night Out” is September 20, 2022.
- Completed review of draft bylaws.
- Library Policies for publications accepted into inventory have been submitted for review by the board.
- Focusing on Marketing. Reviewing bids for Website management.
- Security Fence – pending completion of bid process.

The Board of Property Ministries: Jason Reiter

- Front door locks are nearing completion. When fully installed, the property board will fill holes and refinish the wood.
- Working to resolve a sewer system smell at the school.
- Jason attended a stakeholder/landowner input meeting conducted by PDC Energy on Trinity's behalf. PDC Energy has applied to the state for a future (Guanella) Comprehensive Area Plan for a large horizontal oil and gas drilling project. More information will be made available as it is released.
- The changeover to LED lighting is finished.

There being no further business to bring before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:45 am. The meeting closed with prayer by Bob. Next regular Executive Council meeting October 8, 2022, at 8:30 a.m.

Saturday, November 19 – Youth Serve Day

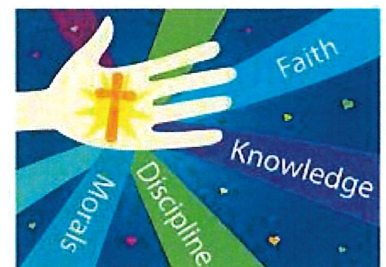

Your whole family will enjoy the sights, sounds, and tastes of the Reformation and learn how the world changed forever. Here are some stops you will make along the way.

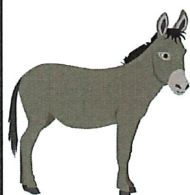

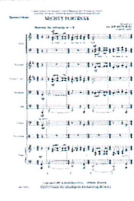

Preschool & K-8

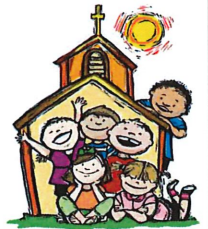
Jesus spoke these words in Matthew 9:37,

These words fit right in with this season, and with our school year theme, Making Disciples for Life – The Great Commission.

One way in which we celebrate this HARVEST season is with our Fall Festival. This will be held on Saturday, October 29 from 11:00 – 1:00 pm. A more detailed schedule can be found in this month’s newsletter, church bulletins, and in the church narthex. There will be a chili cookoff, a Reformation walk, trunk-or-treating, a costume parade, and the announcing of the chili cookoff winners. Everyone is welcome to join us. A sign-up sheet is available in the narthex if you would like to enter or help with any of the events. The more participation, the bigger the celebration.

This is also the time of year where we focus on the school Scholarship Campaign. “The HARVEST is plentiful.” The faith of our students and families varies from a seed that is just being planted, to a deeply rooted crop that is producing more seeds. Regardless, all students are being watered daily, growing in love and the truth. Our goal to raise for the scholarship campaign this year is \$60,000. We will conclude our campaign on Sunday, November 13, which will include a state of the school presentation during the Bible Study hour at church. Thank you for all of your support in this ministry.



The Butter Braids fundraiser has its own special place in the fall season. They will be going on sale October 17 – November 4. You can purchase them from the school office, or you can typically find a school family or two selling them on Sundays. This is a PTL (Parent/Teacher League) fundraiser, which typically raises over \$5,000 per year.

“The laborers are few.” We are truly blessed to have such a wonderful staff. Finding quality teachers becomes more of a challenge every year, and God continues to provide. We ask for prayers for the staff that will be attending the Rocky Mountain District Church Worker’s Conference on October 26 – 28. Students will enjoy a fall break, while teachers spend time in Breckenridge.

Also, staff-related, we keep our Early Childhood Director, Gwen Marshall, in our prayers. She will be on medical leave until Thanksgiving. Renee, a former middle school teacher at Trinity, will be covering classroom duties, and Esther, a current preschool assistant, is director-qualified, and will be assisting with administrative duties.

A note from the Resource Center stated:

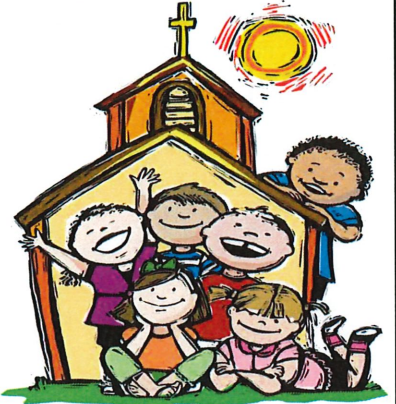

Scholarship Fundraising Campaign!

Our annual Scholarship Fundraising Campaign is in full swing! God continues to bless Trinity and its mission, Trinity Lutheran School. With His continued guidance, we kept our students in the classroom with face-to-face instruction throughout last year. We are excited to share that our Kindergarten class is full and 11 of those students came from our preschool. Tours have continued even after school started bringing us more enrollments. We are blessed.



This year we have 57 students enrolled in K-8 and 24 of those students need assistance. Some need as little as \$100 a month, while some need the full \$373 per month. Every family that receives assistance is asked to do community service hours in exchange for their assistance. One such family has consistently taken care of the mowing of the grass area around the front of the church each week. The whole family participates. Father and son push the mower and do the edging while mother and daughter pull weeds. Another family with three students, had a set back when dad was unable to work for several months due to an injury. They have poured their hearts into working and helping anywhere they can, while continually vocalizing their love for this school and the Christian education their children receive. All the families work cheerfully and full of gratitude for the tuition assistance you provide through your generous gifts.

Our mission is to share the good news of God's love for all mankind. That love is so great that God sent His One and Only Son into this world to suffer our sins and die on the cross to pay for those sins. With His resurrection our salvation is assured. That good news is shared daily here at Trinity with students and their families. God has blessed us so that we may share our blessings and others may be blessed through the gifts that we give. Our prayer is that we never have to turn a student away simply because they do not have the money for tuition. Our example is Christ himself who was born in a lowly manger and served not the wealthy, but rather those who were not. This year our goal is to raise \$65,000. Please prayerfully consider your blessings and giving to the Scholarship Fund.

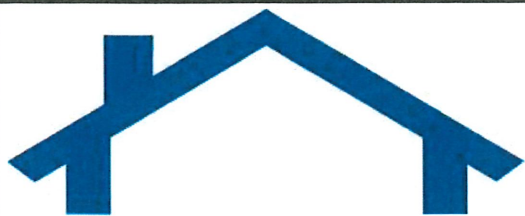

Note from the Editor: Recently, I got *the LOOK* from my grandson. That look that says "How can it be that you don't know who I am talking about? How old are you, anyway?" Yeah, that *look*. He was talking to me about a popular Christian group whose music he enjoyed and all I could do is give a polite nod and a blank stare. I did not make any points on the coolest grandma scale for sure. Wanting to do better, I ventured down that proverbial rabbit hole called Google. I read about the group's lives, their wives, their children as well as their music. I listened to a song or two, then I found an entire recently recorded concert that they did and I was blown away. I will confess that without closed captions, I didn't understand all the words, but Google helped me out with that, too. Their energy was amazing and I understand why I got *the look*. One of their songs really spoke to me and with Columbus Day coming up this month, I thought I would share. The song is called "Burn the Ships". In the same circa of exploration when Columbus discovered America, a conquistador named Hernan Cortes was commissioned to explore the Mexican coastline. (A whole other rabbit hole.) He decided instead to conquer it. His crew was not keen on that given that the barbaric Aztec Empire was in control of the area. The crew wanted to stay safely on their ships. In order to force the crew's hand to follow his lead, Cortes ordered everyone on shore, then he set the ships on fire so there would be no going back. The Old Testament tells us the Israelites wanted to go back to Egypt where life was familiar even if it was a life of slavery, but God had set them free, continuing to provide for them as He led them through the Wilderness. He wanted them to understand that there was no going back. I tend to choose comfort, when given a choice. It is comforting to do things the way I always have, to stay in that space where things are familiar, even if things aren't perfect, it's something I know. The Apostle Paul tells me that God calls me to leave my old sinful life, to "burn" it so I am not tempted to go back. God wants me to brave the unknown, trusting in Him, and embrace my new life that He provided through the death and resurrection of His One and Only Son, Jesus Christ. May you find the strength in Him to continue to move forward, moving closer to Him. Step out of those comfortable surroundings and share God's love with all of God's children. When God, in His time, sends a new pastor to shepherd us, embrace the new life God has given to us and leave the old ways that have enslaved us, behind. As the song says "Step into a new day, we can rise up from the dust and walk away, we can dance upon the heartache, yeah. So light a match, leave the past, burn the ships and don't you look back."
