Where did 2022 go? This year has flown by? Doesn't seem that long ago we were in Lent and Easter and now planning is in full swing for Advent and Christmas. I am excited by all those involved in putting this together. It seems strange to be sharing

about Advent and Christmas, yet, by the time the next newsletter comes out we will be in the beginning of the season.

Let's not forget about the National Day of Thanksgiving. On November 23, which is a Wednesday, we will hold our Thanksgiving Eve Service at 6:30 p.m. with Holy Communion. Our theme is "Abounding in Thanksgiving." We tried this last year, and the congregational response was positive.

The staff, Elders, and I have been discussing and planning worship during a very special time of the year. Most of us think of Lent and Easter, attending special services. Christmas is the announcement of God coming into our world and becoming one with us. St. John in chapter one verse 14 reminds us: ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. We do many things in preparations for Christmas, I love decorating, baking, attending events, but we need a time to be reminded about the real meaning of Christmas. Our theme through Advent and Christmas is: "Be Born in Us Today" every Wednesday beginning December 1, we will have a worship service at 10:00 a.m. In the evening we will have a supper starting at 5:00 p.m. in the fellowship hall or the old gym as some of you refer to it. A family worship using the same theme will take place around tables. We did a similar event in the cafeteria of the school last year. The Sundays of Advent will reflect on that theme in preparation. Christmas Eve services will be an 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. with candle lighting and Holy Communion. Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall on Sundays, therefore we will have only one service at 9:00 a.m. on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. Please make note of this change.

This newsletter should reach most of you before the first Sunday in November, which is "All Saints Day". On that day we will remember all of those who have gone to be with their Lord since "All Saints Day" last year. Special music will be provided by a small ensemble. Because it is a festival day, Holy Communion will be celebrated. Please note that because both the first and third Sundays of the month are festival days, Holy Communion will be celebrated every Sunday in November.

God has been working through the Holy Spirit to prepare Trinity to call a pastor. Together we have talked about heart issues, concerns, and approaching the call as a united congregation. All of us need to continue to lift prayers to God, to direct this process of welcoming a new pastor, and growing together in ministry and fellowship. God has blessed Trinity through this time, and I rejoice where He has led you. I can't wait to see where God takes you.

Guest: Hank Thuener. A quorum was established. Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council. The meeting was called to order at 8:30 am. Pastor Schnegelberger opened with prayer. The September minutes were approved as written via email prior to the meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Cheri Carsten, Interim treasurer, provided the September financial report via email prior to this meeting. Report accepted after discussion.

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries: Ken Clavir

- Advent services begin November 30. Meals will be included with the evening service in the fellowship hall. Various groups will be asked to sponsor meals.

Saturday, December 17 - Sunday School Christmas Program Dress Rehearsal, 9:00 a.m.







Note from the Editor: As I work each day, I often have instrumental music playing in the background. I love to listen to familiar traditional hymns that I can hum along to in my head. Instrumentals give me the freedom to add my own words. Today I have had the tune to "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" going through my mind and I keep coming back to the refrain: take it to the Lord in prayer. Prayer has been on my mind lately. In my relationship with God, it has been it's own journey of growth. As a child my prayers were memorized and repeated nightly. As a teen they were fewer and farther between, but more desperate prayers because I didn't study for a test or lost track of time and had a curfew to meet. It's exciting to be moving towards the end of this pandemic and to have the Executive Council discussing loosening the restrictions put in place over a year ago. However, somewhere along the way, the order of steps for members to reserve and use the Trinity Facilities has been lost, forgotten or just put aside. Here is a reminder of the protocol for using the facility.

PROTOCOL FOR USE OF CHURCH

There is a difference between regular use (such as Bible Studies and meetings) and Personal Events (Anniversary, birthday celebrations) and Special Events (Picker's Paradise), but the protocols are similar.

**First, when planning to use the facility, contact the Campus Administrator Debi Roethemeyer and explain what the event is for. She may be reached at the church office from 7:30am to 4:30pm Monday thru Friday at 970-330-2485. If you are scheduling a reoccurring event like a Bible Study for instance, she will be able to tell you if the facility if available on the day and time you want. Some days of the week have nothing going on and other days have multiple things going on, so be aware you may need to be flexible. A reoccurring event can be put on the calendar and you are done. Please do remember to let Debi know is your schedule changes, i.e. not meeting in July or moving to a different location for the June meeting, otherwise incorrect information may be printed in the newsletter and bulletin. If your event is "personal or special", again, start with Debi to make sure your preferred date and time is available. If special needs and/or your event is an outside event, Debi will check to see if approval from the Trustees is needed. Events that may require Trustee approval would be a Car Wash, Car Show, Garage Sale, etc. The Trustees may want to meet with you to make sure appropriate safeguards for both property and attendants are addressed. A damage deposit may be required.

**Second, call the Campus Administrator to place your event on the Master Calendar. There is only ONE Master Calendar and the Campus Administrator is the one who knows if a date is available or not. Be sure to reserve times that include set up and clean up to avoid overlapping. With "personal" events and "special" events, the expectation is exclusive use of the facility. In other words, no one else will be booked into the facility during your "personal" or special" events. Don't assume someone else in your group has made this reservation, better to call multiple times than not at all.

**Third, Trinity members are allowed to use the facility without charge with the understanding that they are responsible for cleanup and the facility should be returned to the same condition as it was before your event. If the facility is not left in the same condition, a cleaning fee may be charged to cover the cost of cleaning by the custodian.

Remember-when using the dishwasher in the Narthex or the Fellowship Hall kitchen, **YOU** are responsible for **unloading the dishwasher and putting the dishes away**. The next person will not know if the dishes are clean or dirty.

Funerals take priority. Funeral services for members are scheduled to accommodate families of the deceased while coordinating with the funeral home that is working with them. If your meeting or event conflicts with a funeral, you will be contacted by Debi and asked to reschedule your event.

If everyone is respectful of each other's needs and property, everyone will be able to enjoy the use of our facility for their event. We give thanks and praise to God for the blessing He has given us in this facility.



Once upon a time in a galaxy far, far away......just kidding. However, somewhere along the way, the order of steps for members to reserve and use the Trinity Facilities has been lost, forgotten or just put aside. Here is a reminder of the protocol for using the facility for your event.

How to Reserve Use of the Trinity Facility for An Event!

**First, when planning an event, you must to talk to the Campus Administrator Debi Roethemeyer and explain what the event is for. She may be reached at the church office from 7:30am to 4:30pm Monday thru Friday at 970-330-2485. If your event has special needs and/or is an outside event, you may be required to get approval from the Trustees. Events that may require Trustee approval would be a Car Wash, Car Show, Garage Sale, etc. It is a good idea to consult with the Trustees to make sure appropriate safeguards for both property and attendants are addressed. A damage deposit may be required.


**Second, call the Campus Administrator to place your event on the Master Calendar. There is only ONE Master Calendar and the Campus Administrator is the one who knows if a date is available or not. Be sure to reserve times that include set up and clean up to avoid overlapping. Don't assume someone else in your group has made this reservation, better to call multiple times than not at all.

**Third, if tables and chairs are needed for your event such as a Birthday celebration,
Anniversary celebration etc., please have that information ready when booking your date. The number of tables and chairs required and when the set up will be needed is important and pertinent information.

Members are allowed to use the facility without charge with the understanding that they are responsible for cleanup and the facility should be returned to the same condition as it was before your event. If the facility is not left in the same condition, a cleaning fee may be charged to cover the cost of cleaning by the custodian.





PROTOCOL FOR PROVIDING FLOWERS FOR CHURCH ON SUNDAY

Recently, we have received inquiries about how one would go about providing flowers for our Sunday worship services. Below is an outline of how to go about providing flowers.





*If someone has already put their name on the date you wanted, please consider being flexible and choose the week before or after. Often we have had more than one person on a particular date and no one on the weeks before or after.

3.) Purchase your flower bouquet just prior to the Sunday you have chosen. Bring them to the church and place them on the shelves on either side of the cross behind the altar. The church is usually open by 7 am on Sunday mornings and your flowers should be placed no later that 7:30 am. The 2nd service has usually concluded by 11:45 am and you can pick your bouquet up and take it home after that.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO CONSIDER:

*Since the church is locked and not occupied during the week, deliveries are not recommended. If you have your flowers delivered, they will probably come to the school. There is no guarantee they will make it to the church.

*You can bring your flowers to the church on Friday, stop first at the school and ask to borrow a key to the church, place your flowers in the sanctuary, then return the borrowed key to the office in the school. *If you want something special in the bulletin, remember the deadline is Wednesdays at 3pm.

*If you put your name on the Flower Chart after the 1st of that month, please inform Debi in the church office so that she has up-to-date information for others who inquire about availability. If you have any other questions, please contact Pam Clavir at 949-683-7680.
